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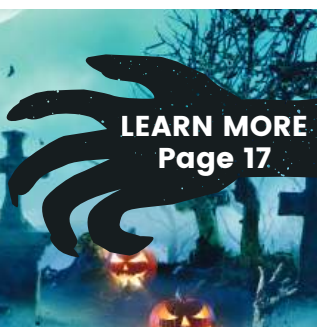

MESSAGE FROM MAYOR SHLOMO DANZINGER

Dear Neighbors,

This past month carried more weight than most, and I want to use this space to reflect on it together.

We recently marked the twenty fifth anniversary of **September 11th**, a day that reshaped our nation and remains etched into every American life it touched. A quarter century later, remembering the victims is not optional nostalgia; it is a duty. Freedom is paid for daily, and it falls to each of us to see that the price is never forgotten.

Rosh Hashanah follows close behind, ushering in the Jewish new year with themes of renewal and hope. To all our residents, I wish a year filled with health, joy, and prosperity. May we carry its spirit of kindness into how we treat one another, remembering that what unites our neighbors far outweighs what divides us.

Yom Kippur, the holiest day on the Jewish calendar, asks something harder of us: honest reflection, atonement, and the humility to seek a clean slate. Whether or not the holiday is one you observe, its lesson belongs to everyone. Let us set aside old grievances and choose, deliberately, to build toward a better year.

Sukkot and Simchat Torah close the season with joy. The sukkah recalls how G-d sheltered our people through the wilderness after the exodus from Egypt, a fragile structure that has always stood for faith and protection in equal measure. Simchat Torah then completes the cycle, celebrating the renewal of a text read anew each year, one whose moral teachings have echoed far beyond their origin, helping to shape the very principles this country was founded upon.



October 7th remains a date we cannot pass over lightly. On that day, terrorists murdered more than 1,200 innocent people, men, women, and children, many in their own homes, in the deadliest single attack against the Jewish people since the Holocaust. Nearly 400 civilians were slaughtered at a music festival, cut down in a moment meant for celebration during a Jewish holiday. More than 250 hostages, including Americans and other foreign nationals, were dragged from their homes where they remained in captivity, tortured, for years. What began as a massacre became a war for Israel's survival. We remember every victim by name and by memory and we stand with the State of Israel and all civilians, on every side of this conflict, who long for its end.

On municipal matters, **the Commission recently passed the FY 2027 budget**, work that began before this Commission took office and that we refined with discipline and care. I am proud of what it delivers: watermain improvements, thoughtful town planning, street end park upgrades, a new restroom at the Hawthorne Tot Lot, and improved street lighting and signage, among other initiatives. There is more ahead in 2027, and I remain confident that steady, good faith work, not noise from the sidelines, is what will move Surfside forward.

KEY TOWN COMMISSION ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Safety in Our Schools: The Commission approved partial funding for an additional School Resource Officer for the 2026/2027 school year, keeping a dedicated officer with our students as they return to class.

Improved Neighborhood Street Lighting: The Town is improving lighting across the community so our streets are safer and easier to see at night, and we have moved the design work forward.

Bayfront Street Ends: The Town is improving the street ends along the bay. Surveys of these small waterfront parks are underway and the design work is moving forward, so they become more enjoyable and easier for everyone to use.

Champlain Towers South Memorial: Engineering work below the ground was approved for the memorial site, a necessary step before construction begins on the memorial honoring the 98 victims of the 2021 collapse.

96th Street Park: The athletic field was resodded, restoring a safe, green playing surface for the families and teams who use it.

Fiscal Responsibility: Commission lowered the tax rate again this year. At the second budget hearing they approved a budget that came in lower than the one first presented and it still pays for the Town's construction projects and the new programs for residents.

October and November typically bring South Florida's highest king tides and the "sunny-day flooding" they can cause in low-lying areas, even without rain. Surfside's stormwater pumps reduce some impacts, but ponding can still occur during the highest tides.

King tides result from the alignment of the Sun, Earth, and Moon. During new and full moons, their gravitational forces combine to create spring tides, which occur year-round and produce higher high tides and lower low tides. In South Florida, the strongest of these tides often arrive in fall.

The astronomical forces are not changing, but the sea level from which tides begin is rising. According to the U.S. government's Sea Level Explorer, regional sea level has increased about 5.6 inches over the past 30 years. NOAA estimates sunny-day flooding has risen roughly 400 percent since 2000, and federal projections indicate another 8.4 inches of sea-level rise by 2050.

Flooding can become especially severe when high tides coincide with heavy rain, elevated groundwater, or coastal storms, limiting the ability of drainage systems to discharge water.

South Florida's porous limestone adds another challenge. Water can move underground and rise from below, meaning seawalls and barriers alone cannot solve the problem. Resiliency must also include improved drainage, pumps, raised roads and utilities.

Surfside's stormwater improvement plan is an important step. The Abbott Avenue and 92nd Street project is nearing completion, with four projects remaining. However, long-term planning must extend beyond stormwater.

The encouraging part is that we have time to plan. The difficult part is that resiliency improvements are expensive.

By planning ahead, Surfside can implement improvements gradually and avoid being forced into more costly emergency measures later.

The purpose is not to create fear. It is to make sure Surfside remains safe and livable for generations to come.

October in South Florida contains much to look forward to. There's a distinct energy as the weather starts to cool, winter residents start to arrive, and Thanksgiving and the winter holidays start coming into view. The regular monthly meeting will, of course, continue to take place on the second Tuesday. But the discussion items—the ones that appear under section 9 of our agenda—will get their

own night, two nights later on October 15th.

I am grateful to the Mayor for proposing this bifurcation of the Commission's agenda. During my first term, it became clear to me that putting the discussion items at the end of a nighttime meeting was simply not conducive to thoughtful discussion. Continuing with the Halloween theme, section 9 of the agenda has become the Graveyard of Good Ideas. And by the time midnight rolls around on meeting nights, we on the dais can start to feel like zombies.

I'm hoping that the new Thursday meeting will bring back the creative, collaborative vibe from the Commission's July retreat. I'd like to use that meeting to bring up some ideas that have been percolating with me for a while, including a new initiative to protect and expand the Town's tree canopy and to introduce options for composting some of the Town's food waste. I'm looking forward to those conversations, and to hearing my colleagues' ideas as well.

As summer ends and children return to school, I am pleased to share key accomplishments your Commission has advanced for our community.

The Ruth K. Broad shuttle is running again with enhanced safety and service. We moved it onto the Miami-Dade County School Board contract, meeting their standards at lower cost to the Town. Forty to fifty children ride each morning, removing dozens of cars from local streets and helping parents balance work and family.

In the heart of hurricane season, Public Works has focused on stormwater systems. Pump stations long overdue for maintenance are receiving the needed attention to keep Surfside resilient. This is not glamorous work, but the kind we are grateful for during a storm.

The dune and beach walking path is underway and open. If you have not walked it yet, I encourage you to enjoy the views and sound of the waves.

On the budget, we lowered the operating millage rate again. At second reading the numbers came in below the initial draft, and capital projects are funded. We also budgeted enhancements to the Community Center beach chair experience, adding more chairs, extending hours, and providing cold water service to elevate the experience for Surfside residents.

Traffic remains the top issue I hear about most. It does not stop at our borders, and neither can the solution. For the first time in years we are meeting with neighboring mayors and commissioners to address it together. The process has begun.

It was an honor to join the Law Enforcement Recognition ceremony and Cafecito with the Cops—both well-attended and meaningful. Thank you to our Police Department, first responders, and Town staff who show up every day.

Wishing everyone a warm and safe fall with a hint of pumpkin spice and good cheer.

SAFETY MEASURES:

- Prohibit children from playing in flood water. Again, there may be debris, in addition to wildlife or pollutants picked up from the environment.

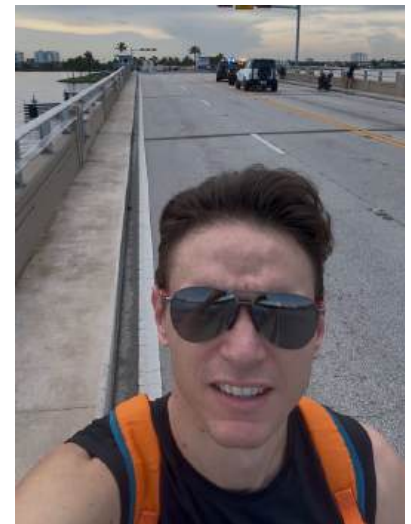
COMMISSIONER ANDREA TRAVANI EXPLAINS WHY HIGH CROSSINGS MATTER

When the Broad Causeway Bridge was temporarily shut down for repairs last month, Commissioner Andrea Travani, a civil engineer and professional engineer (P.E.), visited the site to explain an important engineering consideration.

Travani discussed why high crossings are generally preferred when site conditions allow. Higher crossings can provide greater clearance for vessels and reduce the need for bridge openings, helping minimize disruptions to traffic.

The site visit gave residents an opportunity to better understand the engineering considerations behind bridge design and how infrastructure decisions can affect daily transportation.

138 POLLINATOR VISITS IN 15 MINUTES: GET TO KNOW FLAMINGO GARDEN

The pollinators are buzzing at Flamingo Garden!

In the second installment of the Town's "Get to Know the Garden" video series, Commissioner Gerardo Vildostegui takes on the Great Southeast Pollinator Census and puts Flamingo Garden to the test.

The challenge was simple: Watch one blooming plant for 15 minutes and count every pollinator that lands.

The result? An impressive 138 honeybee landings in just 15 minutes.

The activity highlights the important role native plants play in supporting pollinators and local wildlife. It also demonstrates why the Town is investing in native plant landscaping throughout the community.

Through the 2025 Viva Florida Landscape Demonstration Garden grant from the Florida Wildflower Foundation, the Town reimagined Flamingo Garden with Florida native plants selected to support pollinators, local wildlife and sustainable coastal landscaping.



As the garden continues to grow and thrive, there is plenty more to discover.

MAYOR DANZINGER ADDRESSES CONDO CONNECT SUMMIT ON SURFSIDE RECOVERY AND THE HUMAN FACTOR



In Sept., Mayor Danzinger was invited as a special guest speaker at the Annual Condo Connect Summit. Other notable speakers included Congressman Jared Moskowitz and Florida Secretary of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation Melanie S. Griffin. Mayor Danzinger spoke about Surfside's recovery after the collapse, emphasizing that while statistics and data are important tools for guiding decisions, they don't tell the whole story. He stressed that the human factor — the trauma, grief, and lived experience of those affected — must be considered alongside the numbers, not overshadowed by them, when shaping policy and community response.

MAYOR DANZINGER ATTENDS MIAMI-DADE COUNTY SHERIFF'S PRE-HIGH HOLIDAYS LAW ENFORCEMENT LEADERSHIP BRIEFING



Last month, Mayor Danzinger attended the Miami-Dade County Sheriff's Annual Pre-High Holidays Law Enforcement Leadership Briefing. This briefing brings together law enforcement agencies from around the state in an effort to educate agencies and ensure our communities are safeguarded

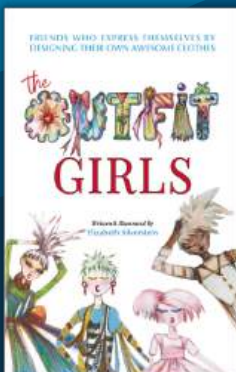
MORNINGS WITH MEDICS BRINGS RESIDENTS TOGETHER

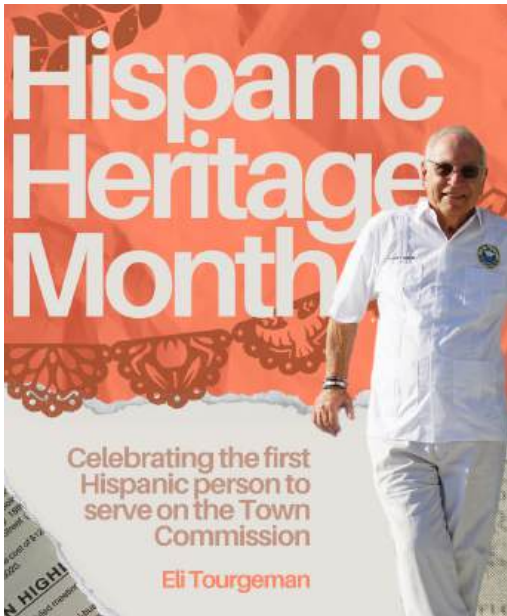

FORMER MAYOR ELI TOURGEMAN BRINGS A LITTLE AZÚCAR TO SURFSIDE



For longtime resident Eli Tourgeman, idle hands are just not an option. Surfside's first Hispanic Mayor has always been characterized by his passion for public service, community and activities. Tourgeman was also the first Hispanic person to be elected to Surfside's Commission in 1986 after serving on the Town's Planning and Zoning Board. Throughout the mid-90s and 2000s, he spearheaded many initiatives on the Tourist Board, introducing Resort-Tax-funded special event entertainment to the community and championing the Harding Avenue business district.

Following this year's spring election, coming back to the Tourist Board was a no-brainer. "I love serving this Town and making sure that our visitors make lasting memories while they're here, and I think we have more work to do" he said. Tourgeman has always advocated for beach events as they highlight the Town's most beloved natural asset. "It's the number one reason why visitors come."

His first venture as Chair of the refreshed Tourist Board was proposing a new beach concert in honor of Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15–Oct. 15), highlighting the legendary Celia Cruz on Sunday, Oct. 11 at 5 p.m. "Celia was truly larger than life. A real visionary who broke barriers and revolutionized the way Hispanic music was recognized in the United States." Cruz went on to win multiple Grammy and Latin Grammy Awards, including a posthumous Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award and the National Medal of Arts, presented by President Bill Clinton in addition to being inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. "Our Town is so diverse; it's one of our strengths. We hope everyone has an incredible time at the concert and enjoys a little Azucar!"

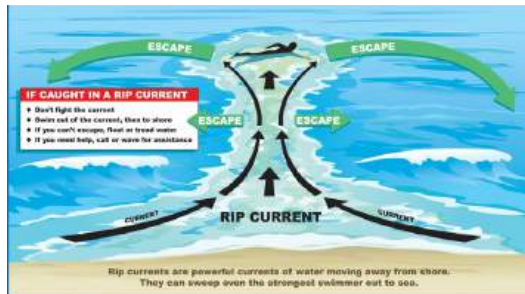

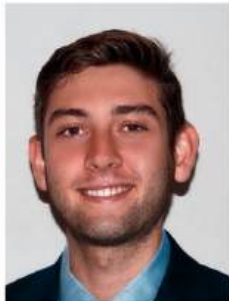
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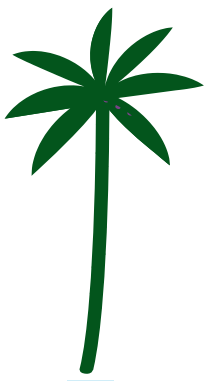
